What to do if you have symptoms...

We must remind everyone that if you or any member of your household exhibits Covid-19 symptoms you must **not** bring your child to nursery until the person or household have under gone a Covid test and received a negative result.

If you have children in multiple rooms/school they must also be kept at home until a negative test is received for the person/people who has symptoms.

If the Covid test result is positive you must all isolate for ten days and not leave your house. In the event of a positive case you must also notify the nursery senior team who will make a note of your positive result and take appropriate action if necessary.

What we have been up to this week...

This week at nursery, all of our bubbles have been very busy playing and learning. Here are some of our favourite activities.

Bunnies

This week we have been exploring sensory bags with different textures inside. The babies enjoys squashing and squeezing the different contents. We also enjoyed tipping and pouring using lentils and cups. The children enjoyed transferring the lentils between the contains and feeling their textures. Another texture we explored was using colourful playdough and cookie cutters to make different shapes.

Toddlers

This week we have been reading the Very Hungry Caterpillar. The children have enjoyed making hand print caterpillar pictures and using sting with pasta to make a chain which we painted to look like a caterpillar. Outside in the garden the children used chalk on the floors to draw their favourite foods from the story.

Toddler +

In toddler plus we have been reading 'Little Red Riding Hood' the children enjoyed using dressing up clothes to role play and retell the story and talk about the different characters. We used lists to write down a shopping list for Granma that would be in Red Riding Hoods basket and used our play foods to pack the baskets in our home corner. Using our grey playdough we made wolf faces and cakes for Granma.

Pre-school 4

The pre-school children have looking at, talking about and sorting using 3D shapes. We spoke about what makes the similar and different whilst learning their different names. The children used to 3D shape to match them with similar 2D shapes and build shape structure. We made spoon puppets from our favourite stories and held a show and tell on World Book Day about our stories and costumes. The children have also been talking about baking bread and writing down the recipes to bake their own bread.

Little Learners in Nature

In the nature school the children have been reading 'The Gingerbread Man' we enjoyed making gingerbread scented playdough and using cookie cutters to make our own gingerbread from the dough. The children also used icing pens to decorate their own gingerbread people. This week we have been talking about recycling and the importance it has to nature. The children helped sort different items in our recycling boxes and learnt about what can be recycled.
