What to do if you have symptoms...

We must remind everyone that if you or any member of your household shows any Covid-19 symptoms you must **not** bring your child to nursery until the person or household have gone for a Covid test and received a negative result.

If you have children in multiple rooms/school, they must also be kept at home until a negative test is received for the person/people who has symptoms.

If the Covid test result is positive you must all isolate for ten days and not leave your house. In the event of a positive case you must also notify the nursery senior team who will make a note of your positive result and take appropriate action if necessary.

What we have been up to this week...

This week at nursery, all of our bubbles have been very busy playing and learning. Here are some of our favourite activities.

Bunnies

This week in the Bunny room, we have been doing many counting activities and our exploring wild animals. Our Bunnies loved listening to and looking at the 'Dear Zoo' story book with all the silly presents the zoo sent.

We made monkeys as we got creative and enjoyed exploring paints and sticking papers as we explored the different resources and we sang songs about the '5 little monkeys' as the adults introduce counting to our Bunnies!

Toddlers

Our Tigers have really enjoyed exploring the holiday themed week! We made our own passports, filling them with stamps, exploring different clothing items for our suitcase templates as we explored mark making and sticking and talking about going to the beach or when taking a plane to go on holiday!

The children loved telling us that they have been on a plane, they eat ice-cream on holiday and joined in as we discussed what we need to put on when playing in the sun during circle time this week. We practiced our counting skills using playdough, shapes and wild animals to make stamps with. The Tigers would talk about how many footprints they see in the playdough, counted number of sides the triangle left in it, with the support of the adult, and they loved making multiple footprints banging all the different wild animals on the playdough as they listened to the noise it makes.

Toddler+ and Pre-School 4

This week our little Pandas have been busy working on a Rainbow fish collage. We joined our creative powers to make a big rainbow fish to display in the Panda room. Our Panda's have been counting the fins on their fish in our math activities and they have impressed everyone with their fine motor skills using the tweezers to pick up and transport marbles to the pots while counting.

We have also been painting our portraits for our new home corner, which look absolutely super \odot

Little Learners in Nature

In the nature school we have been learning all about nocturnal animals and their habitats. We have been talking about how sometimes their senses are much better than ours as they need to be able to hunt for food in the dark.

We also did a great experiment using the fire pit, where the children had to guess what would happen to different foods once we cooked it. We had some very imaginative answers ©
